

O.S.R.T. Student Intern Position

Duties and Responsibilities of the Position

- Act as a role model for all medical imaging students
- Serve as liaison between all medical imaging students and the O.S.R.T.
- Encourage membership and participation in O.S.R.T. events and other professional organizations.
- Keep informed of issues related to the profession and your assigned committee.
- Attend and actively participate in committee meetings, Board of Directors meetings, the Annual Meeting, and any other meetings/activities as directed by your advisor or an O.S.R.T. officer.
- Respond in a timely manner to communication from the Student Director, your advisor, or an O.S.R.T. officer.
- Work with the Student Director and other Student Interns to plan, attend and actively participate in the Student Open Forum at the Annual Meeting.
- Contribute to O.S.R.T. publications (web site and *Cardinal Rays*) as desired or as directed by your advisor or an O.S.R.T. officer.
- Orient and mentor subsequent student interns.

Benefits of the Position

- Develop and enhance leadership skills.
- Active involvement in shaping the future of the medical imaging profession.
- Establishing a network with state leaders of the medical imaging profession.
- Providing input and feedback regarding student issues of relevance to the medical imaging profession and the O.S.R.T.
- Free Annual Meeting registration.
- Free admittance to Francine Todd Memorial Honors Banquet at the Annual Meeting.
- Reimbursement for travel expenses associated with committee duties.
- Free golf shirt designating you as an O.S.R.T. Student Intern.

Expenses for which the Position is Responsible

- Lodging at the Annual Meeting.
- Some meals during the Annual Meeting.
- Transportation to the Annual Meeting and Board of Director meetings.

Position Qualifications

- Student enrolled and in good standing in a medical imaging program, and currently enrolled in medical imaging courses.
- Minimum of 12 months remaining to graduation/completion (Student must be able to serve from April to April).
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Program director approval via signature.
- O.S.R.T. student member or member eligible. Not currently a technologist member of the O.S.R.T.
- Completion of application with personal statement by designated deadline.
