Please consider maintaining your OSRT membership after graduation! The OSRT offers opportunities to obtain CEs in many ways. We hold at least 2 half-day virtual meetings each calendar year, an Annual Meeting that rotates around the state of Ohio, and an annual Student and Educator Symposium (offers ARRT content review sessions for CEs if you are due for your Continuing Qualifications Requirements (CQR) and other CEs related to medical imaging). We also create workshops tailored to specific modalities as needed or requested by members. You can obtain 24 CEs for your biennium while supporting a local/state organization! As we are a non-profit organization, the monies raised by memberships and attendance at our CE events support the business operations of the organization such as securing venues and food for CE events, support of our website, and paying only 3 contracted staff members - one of those being a lobbyist at the Ohio Statehouse who keeps the organization up-to-date on anything that may affect the medical imaging profession within the state of Ohio. Every other person involved with the OSRT does so as volunteers only. Please consider supporting local!

Applicants must:

- 1.Be a current OSRT member in good standing.
- 2. Submit the online application by May 15
 - Attach a professional CV or Resume to the online application.
 - Verify degree and/or certification status by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (or equivalent medical imaging certification) by either diploma or certification.
 - Submit a non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 at the time of application for Fellows.
 - Verify past or present professional organization membership(s).
- 3. Achieve a score of 75 or more during the Fellows committee's evaluation using the Fellows Status Point Scale Rubric.

Selected candidates will be elevated to Fellows status at the Fellows Ceremony during the Francine Todd Memorial Honors Reception at the Annual Meeting of each year (September). Elevated Fellows will be presented with an award at the ceremony.
