I am here today because of the unwavering support of so many—my colleagues, daughters, mentors, and students, so many of whom are sitting right in this very room. Their encouragement inspired me not only to join this organization but to commit myself to driving meaningful change within it.

I wanted feedback not just from myself as a board and active member, but to understand how the ORST is viewed from a broader perspective. This profession is not just about capturing images—it's about capturing impact, precision, and purpose. I want to honor the dedication behind building this organization, but I believe we can take it even further.

It seems that the deeper purpose of this organization—to support one another and connect through a shared passion—is often overlooked. OSRT isn't just a name or a requirement; it's a space where individuals can come together, learn from each other, and grow both professionally and personally. To be a part of something larger than themselves or their hospitals. When we recognize that, we begin to see OSRT not as an obligation, but as an opportunity—a chance to be part of something larger than ourselves, driven by curiosity, collaboration, and a commitment to excellence, and providing quality patient care.

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As we envision the future of this organization, one thing is clear: meaningful progress must be shaped by the voices of our members. That's why I'm committed to bringing forward a more intentional and transparent plan—one built on the insights, experiences, and ideas shared by those who know this organization best.

Advocacy is the foundation of wellbeing, from patients to technologists' safety, to the ideas brought to the table within the OSRT. When we listen collectively, we lead collectively. 

- Completed application and essay.
- Signed letter of recommendation from your program director.

Selected participants receive:

- Airfare, housing, and a stipend for meals and other travel expenses.
- An educational program designed just for students.
- An insider's look into the world's largest association for medical imaging and radiation therapy professionals.
- Expanded opportunities for professional growth.
- Three years of continuing SLDP opportunities.



OSRT STUDENT DIRECTOR PROGRAM CULTIVATING FUTURE LEADERS

The Ohio Society of Radiologic Technologists (OSRT) proudly supports student professional growth through its Student Director Program. Each year, one outstanding student is selected to serve as an official voting member of the OSRT Board of Directors, reinforcing the organization's belief that students are the future of the profession — and that OSRT has a responsibility to help cultivate their leadership.

This program is open to OSRT student members in their first year of a primary imaging or therapy program. One student will be selected as a board member from April 2026 to April 2027. This period of service helps to facilitate strong relationships, a fundamental understanding of organizational operations, enhanced leadership skills, and a commitment to continued service to the profession. The selected student will also attend the OSRT Leadership Academy in June 2025.

The application period will soon open.

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


Foundation Corner



The OSRT Education and Research Foundation (OSRTERF) has been awarding grants to deserving radiologic sciences professionals and students since 19878. At the 2025 Annual Meeting, the OSRTERF was able to award the following grants:



The Philip W. Ballinger Grant for Technologists/Therapists is funded each year by OSRT Life Member, Dr. Philip Ballinger. Dr. Ballinger is a dedicated supporter of higher education in the radiologic sciences and is also a loyal supporter of the OSRTERF. This grant is awarded to a registered Ohio technologist or therapist who is working on an advanced degree, in either a doctoral or master's program. This year the Ballinger Grant was awarded to Brandon Reisinger who is enrolled in the master's program in Medical Dosimetry at The University of Wisconsin La-Crosse.

The Ohio Radiological Society (ORS), a chapter of the American College of Radiology (ACR), is dedicated to promoting and protecting access to radiology across Ohio. This group of physicians, residents, and fellows supports the education of radiologic science professionals and their hard work by funding both a student and a technologist grant each year. The ORS Technologist Grant was awarded to Leigha Wine, who is completing a Radiation Therapy program at Kent State University-Salem.
